1. WHAT YOU MUST TAKE BEFORE YOU LEAVE

Before leaving your country, you must pay attention to take all the official documents in hand cabin luggage:

ENTRANCE IN THE SCHENGEN AREA requires your:

- (M1) Spanish or (M2) French valid visa to enter in the Schengen area via (M1) Spain or (M2) France.
- Original passport + copy,
- Admission Letter,
- Pre-Arrival Letter (provided by LIVE Administrative Coordinator),
- Your flight, bus or train ticket to go to (M1) Barcelona or (M2) Lyon. To find a cheaper flight option you may want to look for flights to a different city, and then travel by train or bus. Example for M2 students: arrival to Paris or Marseille instead of Lyon can be cheaper and then bus (<https://www.flixbus.fr/>, <https://www.thetrainline.com/>) or train (TGV <https://www.ouigo.com/> or <https://www.sncf-connect.com/>) go every hour to Lyon.
- Copy of your Insurance certificate.

FROM BARCELONA - ES TO LYON - FR moving inside the Schengen area requires your:

- All previous 6 items &
- Return travel ticket Barcelona – Lyon (provided by email),
- Bilingual Spanish – French certificate of participation in the LIVE Master integration week (provided by LIVE Administrative Coordinator).

UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION regulations require Lyon 1 to verify original documents with original stamp and signature (with English translation if necessary) of your:

- Passport,
- Diploma (or certificate of successful completion given waiting for the Diploma issuance),
- Transcripts

i.e. the same documents you uploaded in your MyLIVE application used for your selection or provided, more recently, to the LIVE secretariat.

In addition, UAntwerpen-BE usually asks for a digital ID picture (portrait orientation, max. 100 kb, .jpg) for the registration.

A certificate of birth can be useful for some administrative procedures depending on what you face in the Schengen area.

2. FOR YOUR INSTALLATION IN BARCELONA, SPAIN

By Sept 1 at the latest, you reach Barcelona to settle: **Arrival in Barcelona** at various time-points. Please read **ANNEX 5** to consider the timetable of the LIVE student arrival and their housing to connect with each other, if applicable.

YOUR (OPTIONAL) HOUSING AT VILA UNIVERSITÀRIA (Barcelona – ES)

A convenient way to live during your first semester is to stay at the **Vila Universitària** of UAB (Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona). It is located in the UAB campus. You may also choose another accommodation, e.g. in the centre of Barcelona. Keep in mind, however, that you will need at times to reach two different locations in one day to attend classes. Therefore, wherever you chose your accommodation, make sure that public transport is in close proximity. Check the timetables of the subway (<https://www.tmb.cat/en/home>) and the local trains (Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat de Catalunya; FGC; www.fgc.cat/en/lines-and-schedule/) to estimate your daily travel time depending on the housing location. Please contact the UAB-UB local coordinators if you have any doubts concerning accommodation.

UAB LOCATION (Barcelona – ES)

Teaching is expected to be in person throughout the semester. You are thus **required to come to Barcelona before Sept 1st**, unless you experience a VISA or travel problem. Contact the LIVE Secretariat at mylive@univ-lyon1.fr in this case.

Please read your Master LIVE **Handbook S1 2026-27 “Practical information”** for the **access** to the **UAB Campus** and your housing at **Vila Universitària**, and the **map** of the UAB campus. The Handbook S1 will be provided to you by the UAB-UB Semester 1 Coordinators.

3. FOR YOUR INTEGRATION WEEK IN LYON, FRANCE

Students first settle in Spain by September 1 and the LIVE will send you a ticket to travel by train from Barcelona to Lyon on September 1. The integration week is organized in Lyon (FR) from September 1 (train BCN to Lyon) to September 5 (train Lyon to BCN).

- M1 Students from outside the Schengen area: you can enter France with a Spanish Schengen visa, but it has happened in the past that the border police blocked a student (e.g. Turkish) during the transfer because the destination (France) was not that of the visa (Spain). This is why we propose that

all students first settle in Spain, and then come to Lyon by train taking care to carry with your return ticket provided by the program. Another reason is for you to come in Lyon with few belongings.

- Students from the Schengen area: if you don't need the train ticket from BCN to Lyon because you decide to come directly to Lyon on September 1, please inform the LIVE secretariat that will adjust your train ticket from Lyon to BCN, only.

YOUR MANDATORY HOUSING AT CISL (Lyon - FR)

Accommodation (nights of Sept 1, 2, 3 and 4, 2026) have been reserved for all the Master LIVE M1 students at the **CISL** in Lyon (FR).

YOUR UNLIMITED PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN LYON (TCL) 1-day ticket per day from Wed to Fri

On the morning of Sep 2, you will be given the "TCL" tickets (TCL SYTRAL MOBILITES) to travel throughout the TCL network (bus, tram, metro, funicular) on Sept 2-3-4: the number of trips during the day is unlimited.

Simply validate this ticket each time you enter a transport and do not lose this ticket because you must show it to the screening officer, if they ask for it. If you are unable to present your ticket to a screening officer, you are in violation. You must then pay a fine of €60 (immediate payment). Please read **ANNEX 4** to see the public transportation (TCL): "Métro-Tramway-Funiculaire" map. To find your way in Lyon public transportation, you can use the TCL website <https://www.tcl.fr/en/journey-planner/route-finder> or the "TCL" application for mobile phone.

ANNEX 1: GENERAL INFORMATION

Passport, Visas

Those from countries within the European Union are recommended to travel with a valid ID. In addition, depending on individuals' citizenship, a visa may be required.

Please make a copy of your passport and visa.

French law: your passport must be valid for at least 3 months after the end date of your visa. It must also have been issued for less than 10 years to obtain a French visa. Therefore, you should enter the LIVE 2-year program year "n" with a passport expire date no earlier than December year "n+2" to be able to apply for your French visa at the end of semester 2, if applicable.

Insurance

LIVE students are covered by the Erasmus Mundus Student Protection (EMSP) insurance policy, paid by the programme LIVE. Please bring with you a copy of your insurance certificate received by email.

Mobile phone, SIM card

Choosing a SIM card is a personal choice. Advice is available exchanging with M2 Alumni (your buddy identified during the integration week is a valuable source of information for this) and on websites such as

Your Spanish sim card will work in France and the reverse is also true. Anywhere within the European Union for that matter, be sure to set Roaming on: "ON".

Bank account

At Lyon 1, for any payment and/or reimbursement, we need a bank identity issued by the bank. Whatever this is an online bank or a bank with physical counters, the bank must be registered at least in one of the 21 countries, member of the Euro area: Austria, Belgium, (Bulgaria becomes member in 2026), Croatia, Cyprus, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia and Spain. Two reasons: Lyon 1 is not allowed to send money coming from taxes of European citizens outside Europe and you will save money if the bank directly uses euros because you will not have to apply an exchange rate upon receipt of payment.

Choosing a bank is a personal choice. Advice supported by the answers collected in the LIVE quality control survey: your LIVE colleagues of the previous promotion could easily open a bank account in online banks such as "Wise" or "N26" with no issues to use and they quickly obtained their bank identity statement. Please note that "Revolut" accounts are not accepted by Lyon 1 financial services.

Each LIVE student (with or without scholarship) must send his/her **bank identity** issued by the bank to the email mylive@univ-lyon1.fr as soon as possible. Then, we can enter your bank account information in the Lyon 1 system: this first step takes 1-2 weeks so the sooner we receive your bank identity, the better it is for your payments and/or refunds.

Scholarship payment for eligible students

The payment of the European scholarship will start to a European bank account after the checking of original papers (Diploma + transcripts + passport) and the official enrolment of the student at Lyon 1.

Subsistence payment: on the 20th of each month the LIVE secretariat verifies student attendance by requesting a confirmation from the LIVE staff of the university hosting the students, so that you can receive your scholarship around the last day of the month, each month. First payment around Sept 30, provided that we timely received your bank identity (translation in French: “relevé d’identité bancaire” abbreviated in “RIB”; in Spanish = “Detalles del banco”) to operate the transfer.

Please send your bank identity issued by the bank to mylive@univ-lyon1.fr as soon as possible.

Arrival with 1-2 months of living costs

Using the student facilities, you can live in Barcelona, Antwerp and Lyon with 1100€ per month. However, we warn scholarship students that Lyon 1 needs 2-4 weeks to settle the payment of the scholarship, after providing your bank account statement issued by your bank. We therefore advise you to come with savings equivalent to one or two months, as far as possible. If you encounter difficulties that you cannot resolve jointly with your family or friends, share your difficulties with the UAB-UB Semester 1 Coordinators.

Emergency phone numbers

Weather (°C)

- ✓ in Barcelona: Sunny forecast, generally between 20°C min and 26°C max with an average of 4 rainy days in September.
- ✓ in Lyon: Sunny forecast, generally between 14°C min and 23°C max with an average of 6 rainy days in September. With the north wind, nights can be cooler; with global warming, climate can deviate from typical patterns; please check before travelling.

Currency

The official currency in the LIVE countries (Spain, Belgium and France) is the Euro.

Catering, restaurants

When you live in different countries you will notice several cultural differences, among them are the hours you take your meals. If you intend to use the country cooks and restaurants... just ask your search engine “meal times in Spain / Belgium / France” and you will discover that meal times are different and so are the snacking habits, which are very developed in Spain and to a lesser extent in Belgium, while unlike other Europeans, the French don't snack much, preferring to eat in three meals.

Shopping

- ✓ in Barcelona

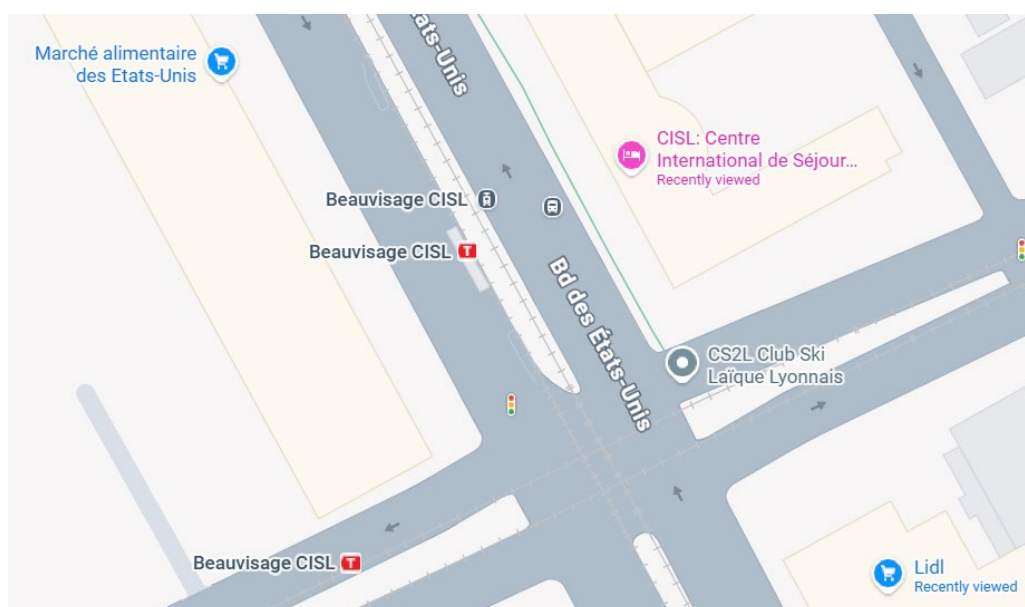
Grocery stores are generally open from 9h to 20h or 21h. Stores in shopping malls may open from 10h until 21h. Other shops are often opened from 10h to 13h and then from 17h to 20h.

You will find a small grocery store in the Vila Universitària of the UAB with a limited selection. A better selection can be found at the Condis supermarket in Bellaterra, just behind the FCG train station (ca. 500m distance from the Vila). Opening hours from 9h to 21h30.



✓ in Lyon

Stores are generally open from 9h to 19h or 20h in shopping malls. Just in front of the CISL (ca. 40 m distance from the CISL), you find two markets: "Lidl" (opening hours from 8h00 to 20h30 Mon to Sat and 8h00 to 12h15 on Sundays) and "Marché alimentaire des Etats-Unis" (organized outside on Tue-Thu-Sat opening hours 6h to 13h)



Local Public Transport

✓ in Barcelona

The local public transport is covered by the FCG and the TMB (Transport Metropolitans de Barcelona; metro, bus and tramway).

The metro in Barcelona operates from 5 am to midnight from Sunday until Thursday. On Friday the subway opens until 2 am and on Saturday and other public holidays, the metro opens 24 hours.

✓ in Lyon

Price: 2.10€ / ticket for 1 hour.

Public transportation is running from 5 am to midnight.

Payment options:

-  TCL terminals no longer sell single-use tickets
-  You can pay directly inside the tram/metro/bus by contactless payment (debit card, NFC technology: GooglePay, Apple pay, etc)

At the automatic terminal you can buy a rechargeable No-Contact Ticket (NCT) - 0.20€ - which you can top up with 1h tickets. The NCT can be topped up 10 times.

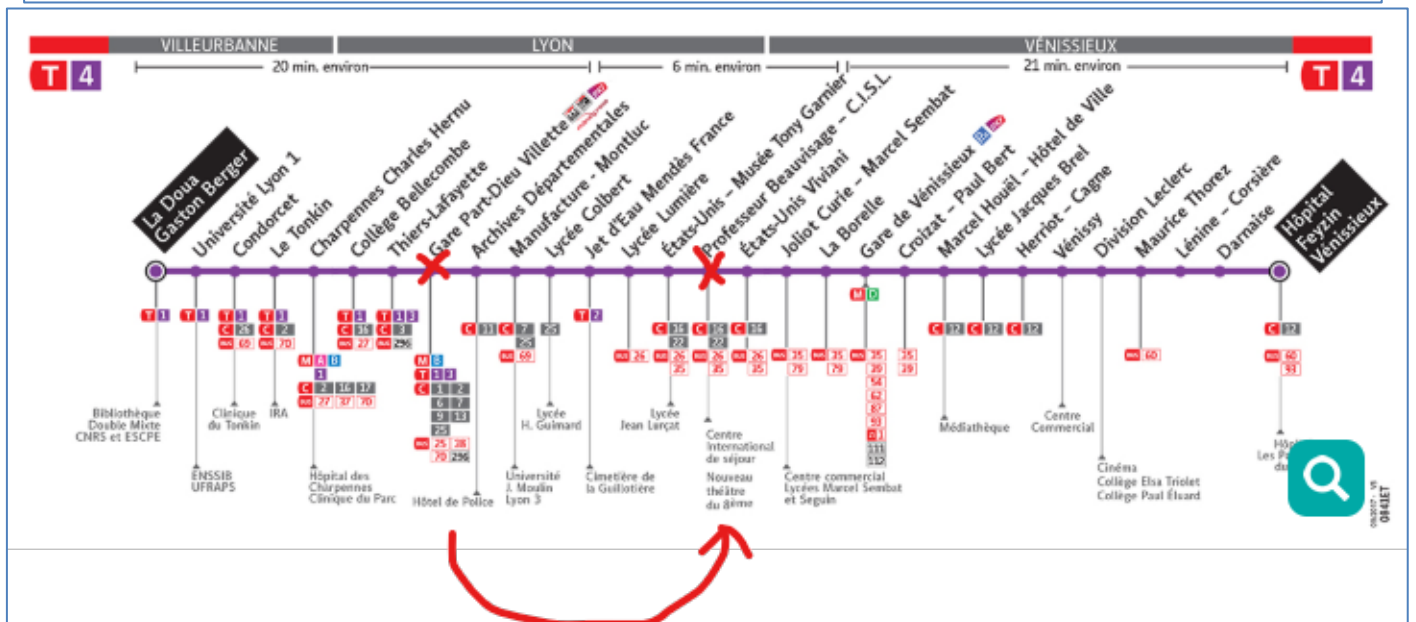
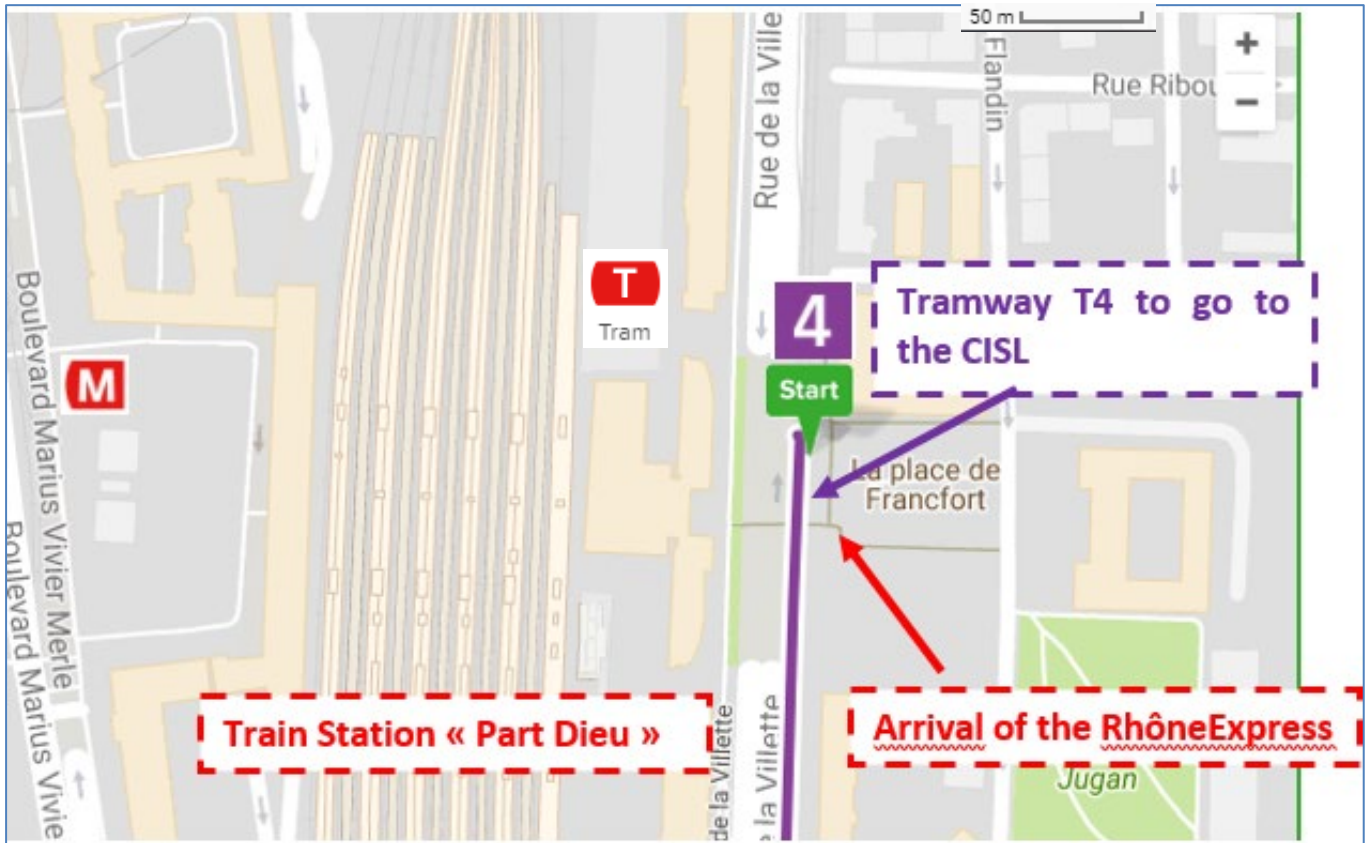
Check-in from 14:00 until 23:00 / Check-out before 9:00

*** From the train station “Lyon Part-Dieu” to CISL (housing)

In front of the train station "Lyon Part-Dieu" or the Rhônexpress tramway station “Lyon Part-Dieu”, you find the road "Rue de la Villette" with the stop “Gare Part-Dieu – Villette” of the tramway T4 (public transportation).

From Lyon Part-Dieu train station to CISL: Take the tramway T4, direction "Hôpital Feyzin-Vénissieux", get off at "Professeur Beauvisage - CISL" in front of CISL.

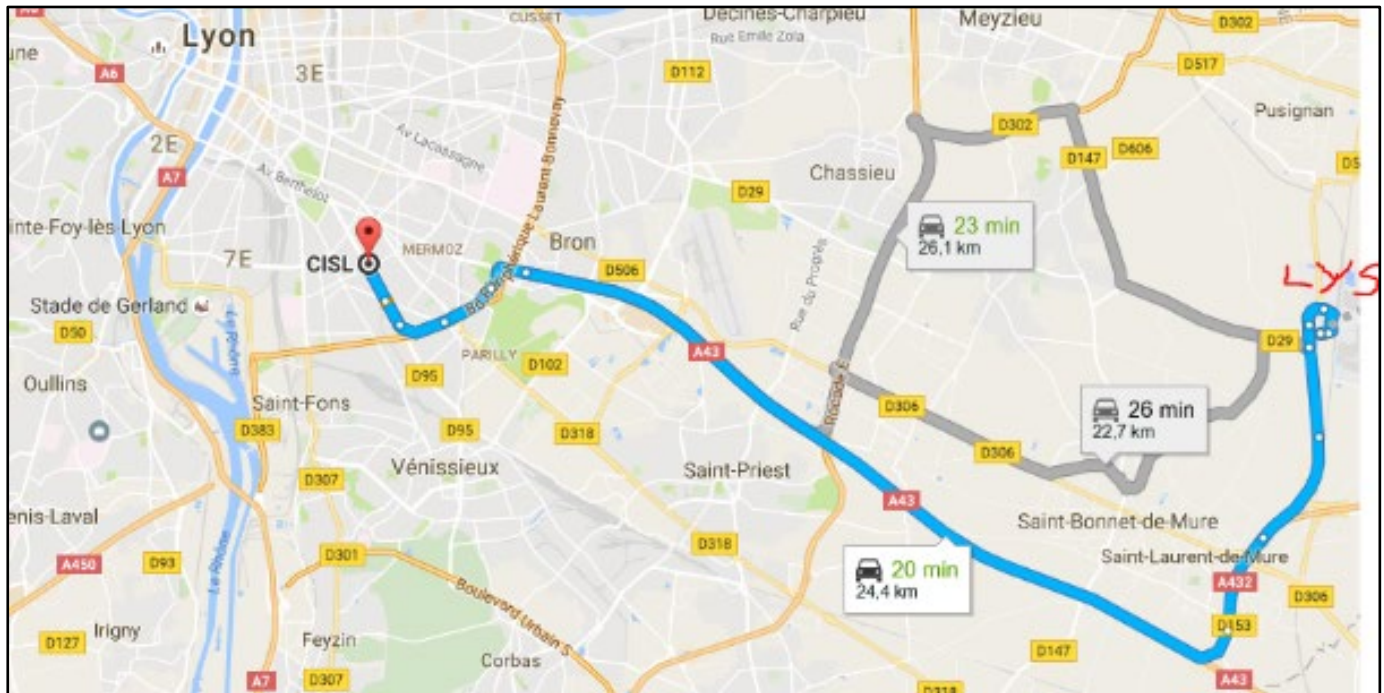
Maps Lyon Part-Dieu train & tramway stations

*** From the Lyon Saint Exupéry airport (LYS) to CISL

Map route from **LYS airport** to **CISL** with Taxi in blue:



Lyon Saint Exupéry (LYS) Airport is ~25 km from the CISL.

- You can take a Taxi: around 80€ between Lyon Saint-Exupéry airport and city centre, to share between the number of passengers

ANNEX 3: GETTING FROM CISL (housing, Lyon)

VIA THE TRAIN STATION "LYON PART-DIEU" TO LYON 1 (University, Villeurbanne – FR)

The **tramway T4** is a direct transportation between **CISL (housing)** and **Lyon 1 (university)** in 30 min and via the **train station "Lyon Part-Dieu"**:

From CISL

- ✓ to Lyon 1: Take the tramway T4, direction "La Doua Gaston Berger", get off at " La Doua Gaston Berger ".
- ✓ to train station "Lyon Part-Dieu": Take the tramway T4, direction "La Doua Gaston Berger", get off at "Gare Part-Dieu-Villette".

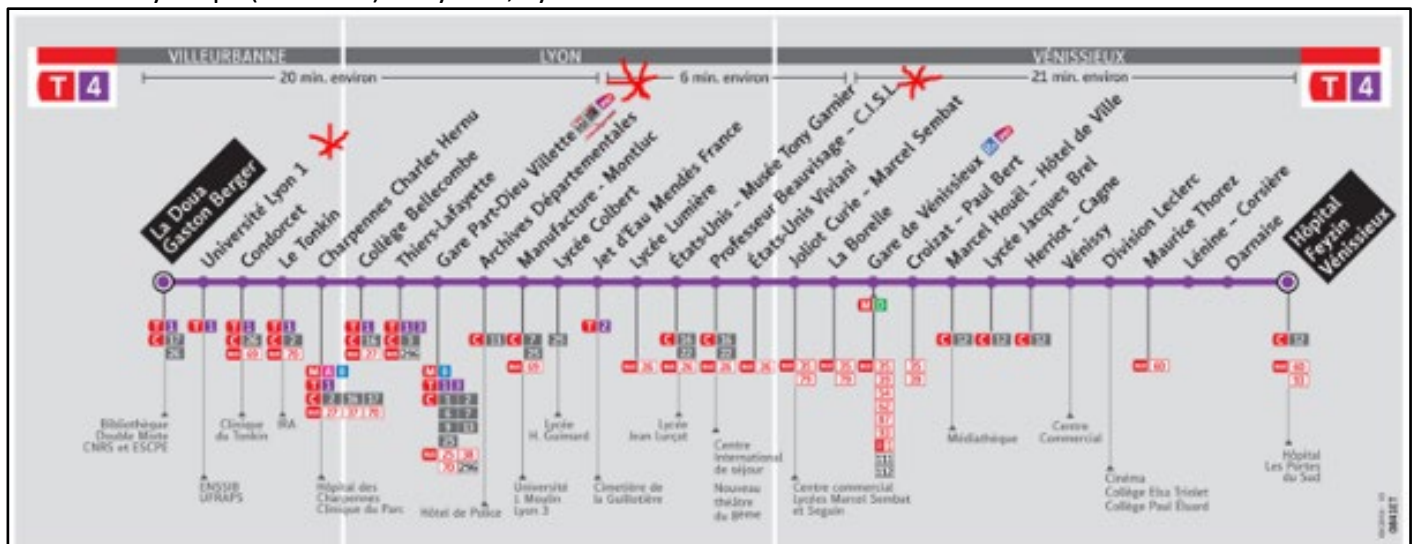
From train station Part-Dieu

- ✓ to CISL: Take the tramway T4, direction "Hôpital Feyzin-Vénissieux", get off at "Professeur Beauvisage - CISL"
- ✓ to Lyon 1: Take the tramway T4, direction "La Doua Gaston Berger", get off at " La Doua Gaston Berger ".

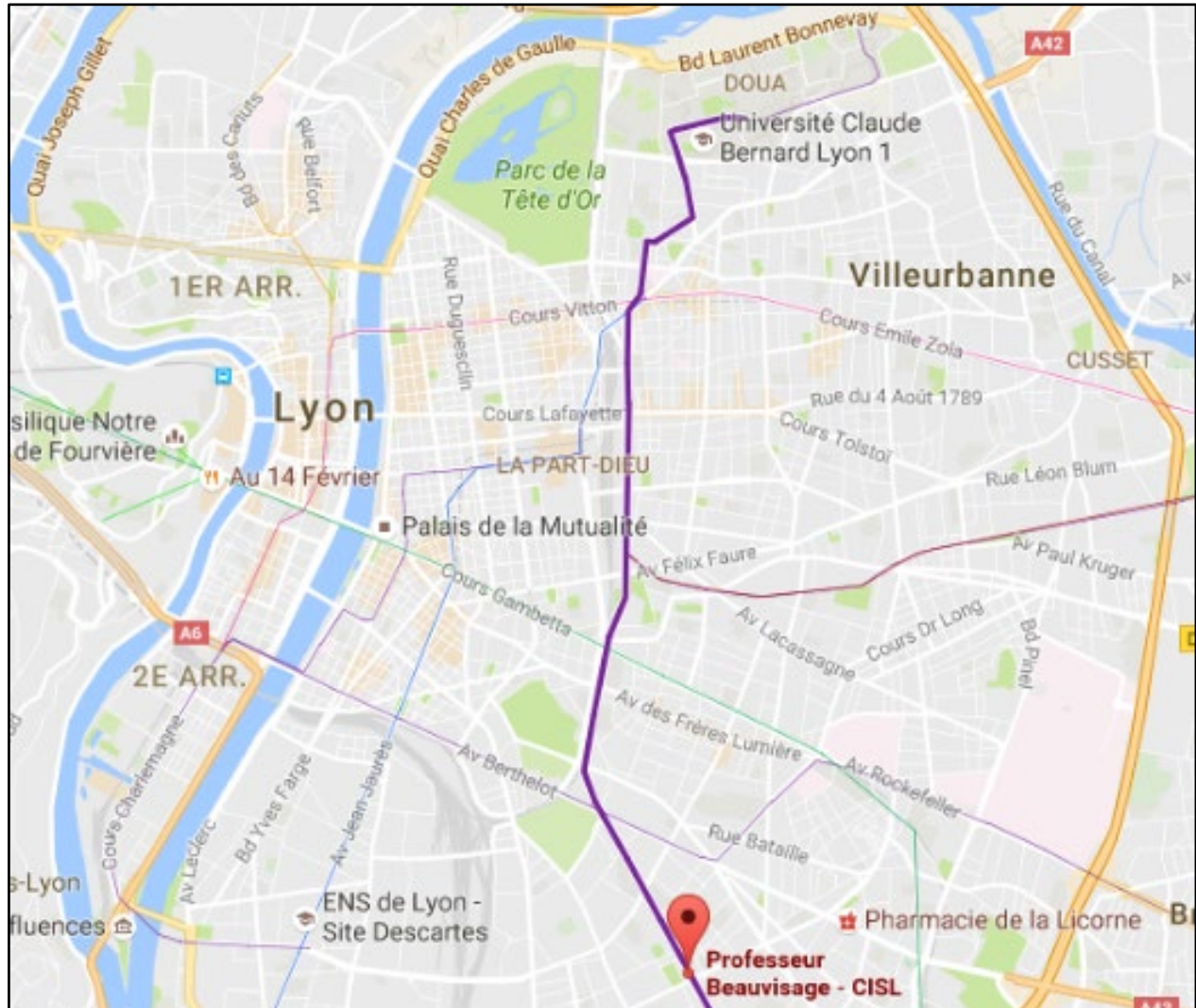
From Lyon 1 (return to housing)

- ✓ to train station "Lyon Part-Dieu": Take the tramway T4, direction "Hôpital Feyzin-Vénissieux", get off at "Gare Part-Dieu-Villette".

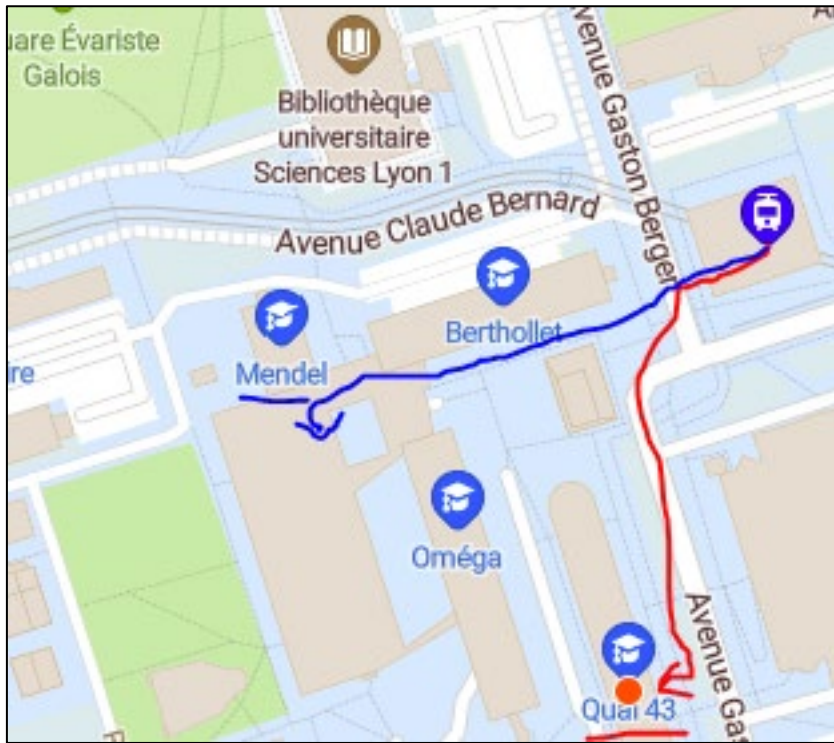
T4 Tramway stops (red stars) at Lyon 1, Lyon Part-Dieu train station and CISL:
